Dive in, explore, and enjoy the energy of the day. We can't wait to welcome you into the West Berkshire volunteering community.

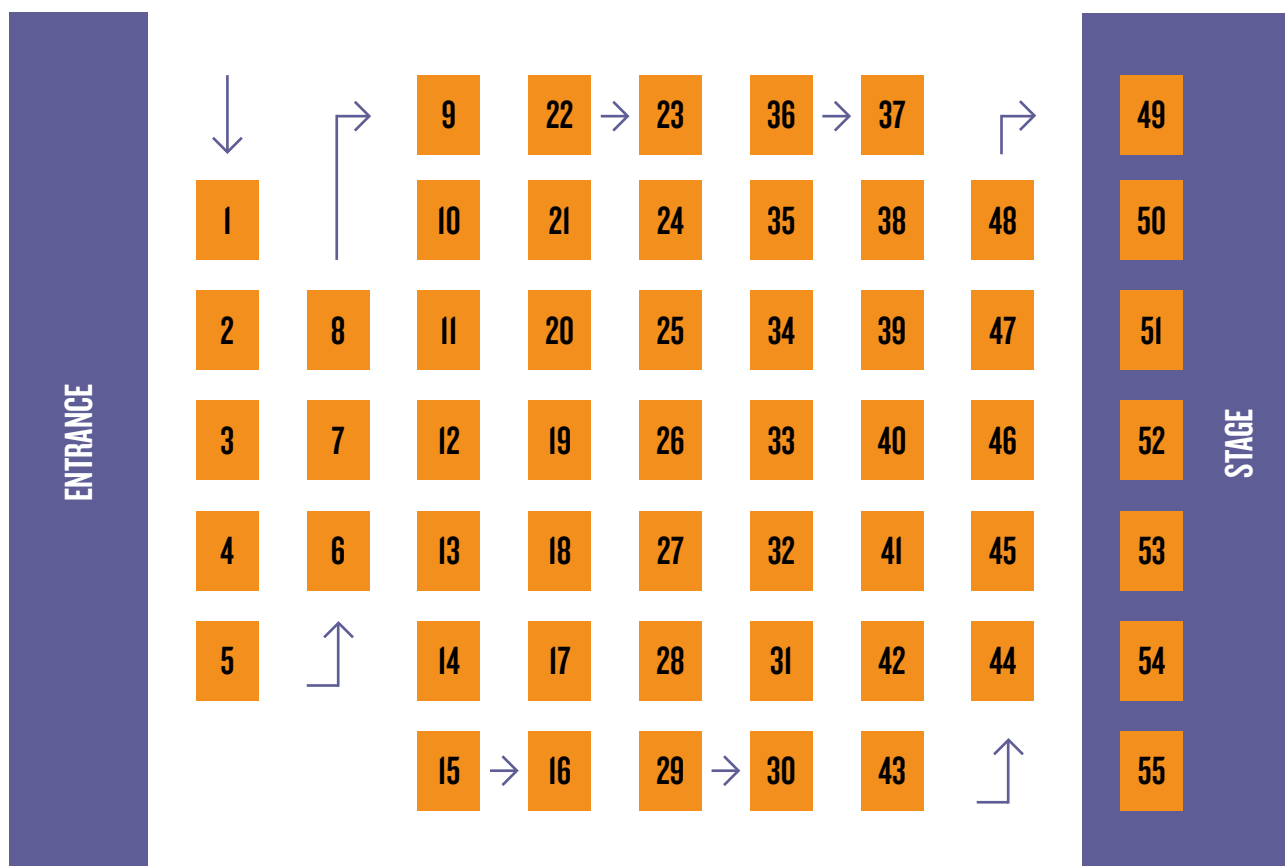

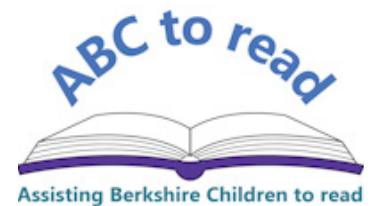

You can drive once or twice a week, just mornings or afternoons or any time you can offer. Talk to our team about volunteer driving.

Newbury and Thatcham Handybus. We provide transport to allow those who have mobility problems or who are more senior to enjoy a fuller life. We provide this service with a group of volunteer Handybus drivers and are always looking for more drivers to add to our team.

Wash Common Library is a community library managed and funded by the friends of Wash Common Library. It has been operating as an independent library for over five years, run entirely by volunteers.
